

Supply List for Preschool Students:

- 1 Book Bag - Large Enough to hold folders, lunches, shoes. Book bags should have zipper closures. No rolling bags.
- 1 1 ½ inch Heavy Duty View Binder, black
- 1 8-pack Low Odor Dry Erase Markers, assorted colors (not fine tip)
- 2 plastic pocket folders - bottom pocket only, no side pockets
- 2 boxes of Crayola Crayons - 24 count
- 1 box of Crayola Washable Markers (regular)
- 1 box of Crayola Washable Markers (thin)
- 4 Jumbo Glue Sticks
- 1 Bottle of White Glue
- 2 boxes of tissues
- 4 rolls of paper towels
- 3 containers of disinfecting wipes
- 1 container of Huggies Natural Care Baby Wipes (alcohol and fragrance free wipes)
- 1 ream of white copy paper (500 count)
- 1 recent family photo
- 1 reusable labeled bottle for water, must have lid that does not spill

Outdoor Supplies:

- Rain pants that have an elastic gathering at the ankle
- Rain boots
- Snow Pants
- Snow Boots
- Mittens/Gloves
- Hat

PM students only:

Students who will be staying afternoons will have rest time following lunch. Each student will need to bring a cot sheet or bedding each Monday. All bedding will be sent home for washing on Friday or as needed.

Crib sheets make great cot sheets or you can buy a cot sheet bundle that includes an attached blanket and pillow under the brand name "Urban Infant Tot Cot Toddler Nap Mat"

A lovey or snuggly friend for the cot.

Rain Pant Types

Dear Pre-K Families, when purchasing rain pants and boots for your child, please keep in mind what your child will be the most comfortable wearing and what will be the easiest for your child to manage putting on and taking off.

The following are a few different styles to consider when purchasing.



The traditional rain pants style has elastic and velcro at the bottom to tighten over rain boots. You can purchase a size larger than needed so that your child can wear these for two or three seasons.



The rain suit style is a great option for really messy play. These are also great in winter to layer over snow pants and jackets for extra warmth and dryness.



A bib style of rain pants is a great option for medium messy play. The bib covers the shirt area if your child does not like to wear a coat when outdoors.

Bedding Options

Students that stay full day for Pre-K will have a rest time as part of their day. Rest time is meant to be a time to rest brains and bodies with minimal distractions while being cozy and comfortable.

Bedding will be sent to school each Monday and sent home on Friday for laundering (unless soiled), beds need to be made daily so we ask for simplicity in preparing your child's rest items.

The following are a few different ideas for bedding.

The "Tot Cot" from Urban Infant. The elastic straps loop around the cot legs while keeping the bedding from slipping. The pillow and the blanket are built into the design.



Traditional crib sheets fit perfectly on the cot. If a crib sheet is sent, please send a small blanket to use as a cover.



One small love item is permitted. Please do not send oversize stuffed animals.
